

# Highway 41 Corridor Improvements



### Project Scope & Purpose






• Project will improve the existing intersection of SC-41 & US-17 by providing a new connection between SC-41 and US17 via Winnowing Way for traffic heading (or coming from) North Mount Pleasant, as well as widen SC-41 to a 4-lane facility (3-lane through the Phillips Community) to provide additional capacity and reduce congestion and associated delays. Project will also provide a 2-lane parkway along the edge of Laurel Hill County Park to enhance connectivity to Dunes West/Park West, and provide a multi-use path along SC-41 from US-17 to the newly constructed path on Clements Ferry Road.

## Project History - Major Milestones

- 2017 Project kick off, commence traffic studies, stakeholder meetings, & hold initial public information meeting
- 2018 Traffic studies continue, developed 3 reasonable alternatives, held public meeting to review alternatives
- 2019 Elimination of Alt 5a, IGA with Berkeley County for \$2M in funding, development of US-17 alternatives, public meeting with Brickyard residents
- 2020 Completed public outreach to determine proposed alternative, virtual meeting to present Alt. 1 as proposed alternative, received 2,889 public comments, held community coordination meetings
- 2021 Developed additional alternative designs to minimize impacts within Phillips Community, Council directed team to advance Compromise Alternative trough NEPA and project completion, additional community coordination meetings
- 2022 Coordination with Park West on Bessemer Road option, Dept. of Justice mediation with CAGE/Seven Mile Community begins, 30% plans and traffic study submitted to SCDOT
- 2023 Completed DOJ mediation, submitted USACE & SCDES permit applications, Phase 3 design services to complete design & permitting
- 2024 Interim improvement project constructed, SCDES public hearing, submitted 60% design plans to SCDOT, SCTIB approves funding application, on-going coordination with USACE
- 2025 Interim project #2 for signal upgrades completed, submitted final right-of-way plans to SCDOT, on-going coordination with USACE.

### **Municipal Collaboration**

#### Town of Mount Pleasant

- Town transportation staff attends all monthly project status meetings.
- Town staff is providing review of project plans.
- Town provided \$200k for interim project design and \$400k earlier in the program.
- We have partnered on two other interim projects for signal upgrades County provided funding of \$85k and \$95k
- Project includes shared use paths to assist Town with their Mount Pleasant Way initiative.

#### **Berkeley County**

- Berkeley County provided \$2M for work on SC 41 in their County.
- Included in early stakeholder meetings.

Compromise Alternative Overview (Current Plans)

Minimizes impacts to the Phillips Community


- Updates the 41/17 connection based on community feedback from stakeholders
- Minimizes property impacts to Seven Mile at the 41/17 connection
- Provides a 2-lane parkway around Park West and along the edge of Laurel Hill County Park
- No right of way acquisitions related to residential properties in Dunes West or Park West (just HOA common space)
- Provides a multi-use path connecting 17 to the new path built by Berkeley County's Clements Ferry project



# **Interim Improvement Projects**

### Interim Improvement Project - Joe Rouse Road

- Project consisted of lane reconfigurations at the US17/Hwy41/Dingle Road and Joe Rouse
  Road/Hwy41 intersections. Improvements at Joe Rouse allows continuous flow of the southbound lane on SC-41, significantly improving delays at peak hours for that intersection.
- Interim project was completed at the end of August 2024.
- Interim project cost was approx. \$1.3 million with the Town contributing \$200K



### Interim Improvement Project - Signal Upgrades

- Project consisted of signal equipment upgrades at two SC-41 intersections with new traffic detection and signal timing capabilities that tie into the Town's adaptive traffic control system.
- Provides improved operation of the intersections at Joe Rouse and Rivertowne/Dunes West (underway)
- Interim signal project at Joe Rouse was completed in Spring 2025, improvements at Rivertowne/Dunes West are underway.
- Interim signal project cost was approx. \$85,000 with funding provided through the SC-41 project budget.




### **Current Status**

#### **Design**

- Right-of-way plans have been finalized and are currently awaiting approval by SCDOT to begin right-of-way acquisition
- Design team moving into final plan development and anticipate final construction plans approved by SCDOT in May 2026.

#### Right of Way

- 168 tracts
- No residential or commercial relocations.
- 48 total acres of land to be acquired



### **Current Status - Permits**

#### **USACE**

- Submitted May 2023
- 30-day public comment period (6/9/23 7/10/23)
- Updated permit drawings submitted March 2025
- USACE finalizing their NEPA document and awaiting completion of coordination with SHPO before issuing permit

#### **SCDES**

- Initial submission December 2023
- Public hearing 6/5/24 with comments sent to County on 8/9/24
- Updated permit drawings submitted March 2025
- Status meeting with SCDES & County on 7/10/25

#### **Environmental Impacts**

- Freshwater impacts 5.48 acres
- Tidal impacts 3.44 acres
- Flooding No roads or buildings will be flooded due to the project design
- Wildlife Detailed wildlife assessment did not identify any protected species in the corridor.
- Archeological one site being crossed by Laurel Hill Parkway requiring further monitoring during construction.

### **Project Costs**

Current estimated project cost is approx. \$245 million

- Preliminary Engineering/Design \$21 million
- Right-of-Way Acquisition/Utility Relocation \$30 million
- Construction & Inspection \$194 million

#### Funding provided by:

- 2016 Transportation Sales Tax funds \$181 million
- SC Transportation Infrastructure Bank \$62 million
- Berkeley County \$2 million

Additional funding was also provided by the Town of Mount Pleasant to help fund interim intersection improvements at US-17 & SC-41/Dingle Road and at SC-41 & Joe Rouse Road

### Next Steps & Schedule

- July 2025 Anticipate Right of Way plan approval / begin Right of Way negotiations
- Summer/Fall 2025 USACE and SCDES permit approvals
- May 2026 Final construction plans approved by SCDOT
- Summer 2026 Construction procurement
- Fall/Winter 2026 Construction begins
- Fall/Winter 2030 Construction complete

### Project/Schedule Risks

- USACE & SCDES Permits
- SCTIB extension (May 2026 per current agreement)
- TOMP encroachment permit & MOA for Laurel Hill Parkway maintenance and project landscaping
- Right of way negotiations/condemnations
